## 2013 NRA OPEN SECTIONALS Conventional Pistol

**Date:** Sunday - February 24, 2013

**Time:** Shooting will begin at 8:30 a.m.

**Location:** James Mangan Rifle and Pistol Range, 34th Ave. and Bradd Way, Sacramento.

**Sponsor:** United Revolver Club of Sacramento

This sectional is a registered match. All regulations for registered matches will be followed.

The 2013 NRA Open Sectional National Indoor Pistol Championships are being fired at Sectional Tournaments throughout the United States. All local challenges and protests are to be resolved on the match site according to procedures outlined in Section 16 of the NRA Pistol Rule Book. Each individual competitor and team firing in a Sectional will automatically be entered in the National Championship at no additional cost.

All fired scores are sent to the NRA Headquarters where they are compiled and a National Champion determined. For the purpose of the National Championship, the National Match Director may require that any or+ all fired targets be sent to NRA Headquarters under provision of Rule 16.1.

All fired targets must be retained until the challenge period for the National Indoor Sectional Championship Final Results Bulletin has ended, two weeks after the bulletin is mailed to all competitors.

**Eligibility:** A competitor (individual or team) may enter only one NRA Conventional Pistol Sectional during 2013. Membership in the NRA is encouraged but not required in order to participate in this match. Tournament officials (Rule 11) may not compete in the Sectional at which they are officiating.

**Teams -** A team will consist of four (4) firing members representing an NRA affiliated club (Rule 2.11 or(A), (B), a law enforcement agency (Rule 2.14), a regular service, National Guard or Reserve Unit (Rule 2.13), or a State Association (Rule 2.12). Teams composed of competitors not all in the same category are mixed teams. Mixed teams in Sectionals may fire for open awards only. Scores for mixed teams will not be used for National ranking or awards.

**Note:** In order for scores from a Sectional to be recognized for Sectional Awards, there must be teams and individuals entered in the local Sectional representing more than one affiliated organization. All scores, except those from mixed teams, will be recognized for National awards.

**NRA Membership Number:** All competitors who are members must put their NRA Member ID number on their entry card.

**Rules:** Current NRA Conventional Pistol Rules will govern.

**Equipment:** .22 Caliber Pistol (Rule 3.4)

**Distance:** 50 feet

**Targets:** B-2, slow fire target, B-3, timed/rapid fire target. Turning targets will be provided for the Sectional Tournament.

**Score Cards:** Special Sectional score cards will be used and must be signed by the competitor to be considered for National ranking and awards. If category is not indicated on the score card, competitor will be placed in the Civilian category.

**Souvenir Pins:** NRA will furnish to the sponsors a souvenir pin for each competitor.

**Categories:** The National Individuals and Team Championships, separate class awards will be given in each of three categories; Civilian (Rule 2.2), Police (Rule 2.4), and Service (Rules 2.5, 2.6 and 2.7) subject to the conditions of the award schedule. In addition class awards in a State Association (Rule 2.12) category will be given in the Team Match.

**Classification:** All competitors will be classified according to the NRA Classification System in individual and team matches and must exhibit their classification card or Temporary Score record Book at the Statistical Office. Unclassified competitors will fire in the Master class if they do not have an assigned Classification (Rule 19.6).

**Entries:**

Individual - Entries in individual matches will be made at the match prior to the start of the individual match on the provided entry form accompanied by cash, check or NRA or URC award points. Be sure to indicate your NRA identification number and correct Pistol Classification.

Teams - Entries made for team participation should be indicated on the individual entry card. Team entries must be made by the team Captain in person prior to the start of the firing team match.

Entries Close - Individual and team entries must be received at least 10 minutes prior to the start of firing of the match.

Entries Limited - Entries are limited to no more than three relays of fourteen (total 42) competitors.

**Fees:**

NRA Sectional Registration Fees include entry into the 2013 NRA Indoor Pistol Championships.

Individual Matches: \$20 per competitor

Team Matches: \$20 per team

**Squadding:**

Matches will be squadded and assignments made by the Statistical Office. Teams are not required to be squadded to fire as a unit.

**Match Schedule:**

Match #1 - 20 shots slow fire, 2 strings of 10 rounds, 10 minutes per string.

Match #2 - 30 shots, 10 rounds slow fire, 10 rounds timed fire, 10 rounds rapid fire - Gallery Course.

Match #3 - 20 shots timed fire, 4 strings of 5 rounds, 20 seconds per 5 shot string.

Match #4 - 20 shots rapid fire, 4 strings of 5 rounds, 10 seconds per 5 shot string.

Match #5 - 90 shot aggregate.

Match #6 - Team Match - NRA Gallery Course - All members of team must fire.

**Sectional Award Schedule:**

Individual - Awards will be provided by the NRA for the Section Individual matches on the following basis:

If there are fewer than 5 entries in a category they will be combined with entries of another category within the same class.

If there are fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be no awards provided in that class. All competitors will be moved to their respective categories and combined with the next higher class. Competitors of lower classification will not be combined with the High Master Class. If fewer than 5 entries in the High Master Class, they will compete for open awards only.

An individual or team winning an open award will not be entitled to a class award in the same match. Such awards will be passed down to the next eligible individual or team.

Team - NRA will provide awards at the Sectional level for the Open Winning Team only.

**NRA Individual Awards:**

Open Awards - First place will be given regardless of the number of competitors in the Sectional. There must be a minimum of 15 competitors for second place to be given and a minimum of 30 competitors for third place to be given.

Winner - Gold Medal and 15 NRA Award Points.

Second - Silver Medal and 10 NRA Award Points.

Third - Bronze Medal and 5 NRA Award Points.

Class and Category Awards - Separate awards will be given for Match #5 in the five classes: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, and Marksman and the three categories. There must be a minimum of 5 competitors in a class and category to establish competition, 8 or more to provide second place and 13 or more to provide third place.

First in Class and Category - 10 NRA Award Points.

Second in Class and Category - 8 NRA Award Points.

Third in Class and Category - 6 NRA Award Points.

**NRA Team Awards:**

Open Awards - NRA will provide awards for the Open Winning Team only.

Winning Team - 20 NRA Award Points (5 per team member).

### **National Individual Awards:**

Open Awards - First place will be given regardless of the number of competitors in the National Individual Championship. There must be a minimum of 25 competitors for second place to be given and a minimum of 35 competitors for third place to be given.

- Winner - Trophy and gold medal and 50 NRA Award Points.
- Second - Silver Medal and 40 NRA Award Points.
- Third - Bronze Medal and 30 NRA Award Points.

### Special Awards –

- Woman Champion - Trophy
- Junior Champion - Trophy

Class and Category Awards - Separate awards will be given in the five classes: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, and Marksman. There must be a minimum of 5 competitors in a class and category to establish competition, 8 or more to provide second place and 13 or more to provide third place. An additional 3 NRA Award Points will be given in each category of each class for each 20 entries or major fraction thereof over 50.

- First in Class and Category - 10 NRA Award Points.
- Second in Class and Category - 8 NRA Award Points.
- Third in Class and Category - 6 NRA Award Points.

### **National Team Awards:**

- Winning Team - 4 Gold Medals
- Second Place Team - 4 Silver Medals
- Third Place Team - 4 Bronze Medals

Class and Category Awards - Separate awards will be given. A team winning an open award will not be entitled to a class award. An additional second place award will be made in each category of each class for each 20 teams or major fraction thereof over 40.

- First Place - 4 Silver Medals
- Second Place - 4 Bronze Medals

### **Local Sponsor Individual Awards:**

Class Awards - Separate awards will be given for Matches 1 through 5 in the five classes: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, and Marksman. There must be a minimum of 5 competitors in a class to establish competition, 8 or more to provide second place and 12 or more to provide third place. No awards will be given for separate categories.

For Matches 1 thru 4 -

- First in Class - 3 URC Award Points.
- Second in Class - 2 URC Award Points.
- Third in Class - 1 URC Award Points.

For Match 5 -

- First in Class - 5 URC Award Points.
- Second in Class - 3 URC Award Points.
- Third in Class - 1 URC Award Points.

### **Local Sponsor Team Awards:**

Class Awards - Separate awards will be given in the five classes: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, and Marksman. There must be a minimum of 3 teams in a class to establish competition, 5 or more to provide second place and 8 or more to provide third place. No awards will be given for separate categories.

- First in Class - 3 URC Award Points per team member.
- Second in Class - 2 URC Award Points per team member.
- Third in Class - 1 URC Award Point per team member.
